



19+ Bursary and Advanced Learner Loan Bursary Guidance 2018 – 2019

The purpose of the Bursary is to provide financial support for students with a specific financial hardship preventing them from taking part in or from continuing in learning.

1. **Hardship funding** – this provides general financial support for vulnerable and financially disadvantaged students. We can provide support towards course-related costs such as course trips, books and equipment (where costs are not included in the funding rate), transport costs, examination fees, and registration fees. In exceptional circumstances, we may be able to help with course fees for students who need financial support to start or stay in learning. Help with fees does not apply to Advanced Learner Loan students.
2. **20+ Childcare funding** – this is for students aged 20 or older on the first day of learning who are at risk of not starting or continuing learning because of childcare costs. This can only be used to pay for childcare with a childminder provider or childminder agency who is registered with Ofsted. (Parents who are aged under 20 should apply to Care to Learn <https://www.gov.uk/care-to-learn> for help with childcare costs)
3. **Residential Access funding** –this is only available in exceptional cases to support students where they need to live away from home. Help with the cost of accommodation may be available for students who live more than reasonable daily travelling distance from college. Eligibility is based on the 16-18 Residential Support Scheme policy.

Eligibility – general requirements

Age: You must be 19 or over on 31 August 2018.

Residence Requirement: You qualify for “home” fees. If you are unsure whether you qualify as a “home” student, please contact the International Student Adviser in the Advice Shop

Receive a means-tested benefit or are on a low income: Students with an income of under **£22,000** are eligible to apply. Parental income is not counted but the income of any spouse or partner is. If you are married or living with a partner the combined income threshold will be **£35,000**

Study: Studying an ESFA (AEB) funded course. You will **not** be eligible to apply if you are undertaking a “commercial” course, are an apprentice or are on a Higher Education course.

Advanced Learner Loan Bursary: you need to have had an Advanced Learner Loan approved before you can apply.

Young Carers

A Young Carer is somebody aged between 16 and 24 years old who cares for, or is affected by, a family member who has any of the following: Physical disability, Long-term physical illness, Mental health problem, Learning difficulty, Drug or alcohol misuse problem.

Caring can mean giving someone practical help, like helping a parent to get dressed, but it can also be in the form of emotional support, for example caring for someone with mental health problems.

If you are a Young Carer, we would like to offer you extra support; please tell us the types of things that would make a difference to you so that we can give you extra help.

19-24 Care Leavers

Additional support will be available for those students who are care leavers.

Attendance and Behaviour Requirements

In order to receive your bursary payments, we expect you to attend 100% of your timetabled lessons. We also expect you to meet the standards of behaviour that we set out in the Student Charter.

In exceptional, approved, circumstances where your attendance has failed to meet our standard, we may take into account mitigating circumstances at the discretion of your Teacher, Tutorial Supervisor or Programme Manager. Please inform us if you have any special circumstances including disability that could affect your attendance.

Child Care Costs We would normally pay for 100% of college teaching time plus any approved travelling time if required. Students in receipt of Early Years childcare funding will be expected to use these hours to cover study time before claiming funding from the College. In exceptional circumstances we may be able to make additional financial support for childcare, e.g. to enable students to stay in work. Help with Child Care costs will be awarded subject to receipt of student's timetable to confirm course hours. No payments will be available for half terms, Christmas or Easter holidays or for food and drink supplied by the nursery. Anyone who is under 20 at the start of their course should seek childcare funding through the government's Care to Learn scheme.

All payments are normally subject to a minimum attendance level (see Attendance and Behaviour above). All payments will be made direct to the providers.

Payments

Awards are divided into 6 payments throughout the academic year, one each half term. The table above gives example of the award you may receive:

Payments will normally be paid into your bank account by direct transfer (BACS). Your first bursary payment will be released once we can confirm you are attending lessons via the electronic registers. We check this each Tuesday with the payment transferring into your account by the end of Friday that week.

Awards will normally be paid into your bank account and will only be paid into another person's account in **exceptional circumstances.**

If you do not have a bank account we can pay into, you will need to open one.

Subsequent bursary payments are dependent upon attendance; we expect 100% attendance.

Further half termly payments will be triggered automatically if your attendance is satisfactory and paid into your bank account.

Residential Support Scheme

Help with the cost of accommodation may be available for those students who live more than reasonable daily travelling distance from college. Eligibility is based on the 16-18 Residential Support Scheme policy.



Other Conditions of Support

- By signing the Bursary Fund application form you are agreeing that you understand that Bursary payments are dependent on a satisfactory level of behaviour and an attendance rate of 100%. Bursary payments may be cancelled if your attendance rate falls below 100% (see 'Attendance and Behaviour Requirements' above for details of exceptional mitigating circumstances) or your behaviour in College is unacceptable.
- You agree to notify the college of any change in your financial circumstances.
- You may be required to pay back all, or some, of the award in the event of early withdrawal from the course, including the return of any equipment given/purchased.

Appeals Procedure

In the event of your application being refused by the college, you will have the right of appeal. In the first instance, contact the Finance Advice Team with more information. If this does not resolve the matter a further appeal can be made in writing and addressed to the Director of Student Services for consideration by the Appeals Committee. You will be sent a response within 10 working days. You should bear in mind that the Bursary Fund Committee's original decision will normally be upheld if no new evidence of your financial hardship is forthcoming. However, you may choose to make an official complaint to the College. A complaints form is available from the Advice Shop reception desk.

Application Procedure

Please complete the online application form, uploading evidence as required. If you are unable to provide evidence online, you can scan and email to us or bring to the Advice Shop for copying. Paper forms will be available for students unable to access online applications and completed forms should be posted to the address below or handed in at the Advice Shop Reception.

Please note it is your responsibility to tell the DWP about your studies and any bursary support that you receive from us in case the course or payments affect your eligibility to some benefits.

Fraud

Any application which is found to be fraudulent i.e. through false representation of household income or of other eligibility rules may be cancelled and the student may be subject to disciplinary measures by the college.
