Severe Weather Policy

When snow or hazardous road conditions make the closing of the Nursery necessary, the procedures outlined below will be followed.

- If the College is closed then the Nursery will automatically close.

- Alternatively, the local radio stations will also be informed of the decision.
- Although the Nursery will endeavour to open at all times in conjunction with the College, a situation could arise where not enough staff are able to travel into Norwich. In the event of this happening we will implement our Emergency Staffing Procedure.
- If for any reason we need to close the Nursery early due to a change in circumstance we will again notify you at the earliest opportunity.

<u>Nursery Staff</u> - This term we have several college students at the nursery completing work experience placements. We will display a photo of the student working in your child's room so that you are aware who is in the nursery. Students are supervised at all times by our fully trained nursery nurses.

Tapestry, our online individual learning journeys

As most of you will know, Tapestry is an educational software package that enables us to produce an on-line learning journal for every child. Your child's individual learning journal can be accessed by logging on with a secure username and password. You will then be able to view all your child's observations, photographs and even video from their time at nursery. This will enable you to follow your child's individual progress closely and you can reflect upon their achievements with your child. You can add comments so that we, as a nursery, find out about which activities your child really enjoyed and the learning they get at home.

We are sure that you will love this way of viewing your child's achievements as much as we do! Please ensure you have completed a consent form so that you can access your child's Tapestry account. You will be given a diary that will be used in conjunction with Tapestry to share information and activities between home and nursery.

It was lovely to see how the children interacted with the elderly residents and how they understood that in some rooms they needed to be quiet while in others they were encouraged to sing loudly!


We all enjoyed this visit very much and plan to visit each term We hope to visit again before the Easter vacation.


